Exposition of Romans Syllabus

Course Description

This course is an expositional study of the book of Romans.

Course Objectives

After completing this course the student will:

- 1. Remember the basic content and message of Romans.
- 2. Identify the major themes of Romans.
- 3. Know major problem passages and their possible solutions related to Romans.
- 4. Gain a greater appreciation for the canonical contribution of Romans.
- 5. Grow in spiritual maturity through careful and consistent application of the principles found in Romans.

- 2. Class notes

Course Assignment Description

- 1. Read Romans at least twice during the length of the course. There is no substitute for reading the Scriptures!
- 2. Keep a notebook (preferably a 3-ring binder) devoted *specifically* to Romans. The notebook should contain the course handouts, your notes, and any assignments that you do for this course. Organizing these materials now will make them accessible in the future as you continue your studies and as you may have opportunities to teach the book.

Graded Option

Students interested in an enhanced learning experience can elect to participate in a graded option. For the voluntary graded option the student will be required to do the Bible reading, two additional written assignments, take the exam, and attend 75% of the class sessions (cannot miss more than 8 sessions or 4 nights). The student should let the instructor know that they want to participate in this option. *This option is completely voluntary*.
